

The PLAY Program empowers our senior students to take on leadership roles by equipping them with the skills to facilitate fun and inclusive games with junior students during recess and lunchtime.

Not only will students be connecting with one another and engaging in physical activity, but they will also be developing important life skills such as leadership, cooperation, teamwork, and resilience.

With the training now complete, our student leaders are beginning the next exciting phase—planning the implementation of the program. Their efforts will be supported by Ms Noonan, Ms Pothisack, Mrs Gigi and Mrs Henwood as the program moves forward.

We look forward to seeing these student-led activities bring joy to our playground and strengthen the sense of community and connection across year levels.

We are currently taking enrolments for 2026 Prep. If you, your friends or neighbours have a child who will be 5 years old before the end of April 2026, please encourage them to enrol at their local neighbourhood school as soon as possible.

Please email your supporting documents to iramoo.ps@education.vic.gov.au or bring the following documents into our office:

- The child's Birth Certificate (front and back)
- Immunisation History Statement
- Two documents for proof of the child's permanent residential address**, either:
 - Contract of sale/title document/rates notice (for homeowners) or
 - Rental agreement provided by a real estate agent (for tenants) or
 - Any current Centrelink related document e.g. health care card or
 - A current document from the Australian Taxation Office along with one other current piece of evidence such as a utilities bill (eg. gas/electricity).

Please note that documents must be original or certified copies.

**Statutory declarations will not be accepted, and no enrolment will proceed without the required documentation.
