Iramoo Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our school's voluntary Parent Payment financial contributions for 2026.

Please find our Parent Payment schedule for 2026 attached.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. We want to thank you all for your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time.

Iramoo Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

In 2026 we are:

- Fully subsidising our Kids & Fruit program so that it is available to all students.
- Maintaining the voluntary contribution for curriculum items per student as **\$80**.

### **Financial Support for Families**

Iramoo Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options so that children do not miss out. These include:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)
- individual payment plans for extra-curricular items and activities.
- State Schools' Relief (SSR)

### **CSEF**

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports and Excursions (CSEF) funding - \$400.00 per child. This money can be used to help cover the costs of camps, excursions, incursions and/or swimming. CSEF applications are open from the first day of Term 1, 2026. Parents or legal guardians are required to submit a new CSEF application form each year.

### 2026 PARENT PAYMENT SCHEDULE

#### CURRICULUM CONTRIBUTIONS

Although the Government provides a grant for children's books and other supplies each year, it is not enough to cover all of our essential student learning items.

Our School Council makes a decision each year on what the Parent Payment amount will be. For 2026, it will be \$80.

At Iramoo Primary School, these items are purchased by the school and provided to **every** student.

Curriculum Contribution Items	Description	Cost
Stationery	All essential stationery items including: Workbooks, pencils, reading diaries, glue, textas etc.	\$30
Classroom Projects	Bulk consumable materials / supplies for items produced in class such as: models and other creative designs including Science projects	\$20
Specialist Programs - Visual Arts - Music - Phys. Ed - Spanish - Science Technology Engineering Maths - STEM	During specialist classes, students will print or produce projects and experiment with a range of materials, while exploring these areas. Items may include consumable materials such as clay, cardboard and decorative supplies (i.e. glitter, feathers and stick on adornments). Students may also create their own costumes for special performances or products on our 3D printer.	\$10
Online Subscriptions	Online access to a range of educational applications such as Reading Eggs, Matific, Scratch, Duolingo	\$20

# PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

## ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



### FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



### PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



### SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
